Levels:	Contestants will be divided into four levels.
Level 1:	• Students enrolled in 1st year high school-level Japanese language study
Level 2:	• Students enrolled in 2nd year high school-level Japanese language study
Level 3:	• Students enrolled in 3rd year high school-level Japanese language study
Level 4:	• Students enrolled in 4th year high school-level Japanese language study

students in each	• The students of virtual schools may pair up with the students from other

	• Each school may submit two teams for each level
Topic:	Japanese customs, history, geography, language, current events, pop- culture, and other cultural aspects about Japan
Eligibility:	• Each school may submit up to two teams for each level.
	• Contestants must be current high school students.
	<ul> <li>Contestants have not lived in Japan for more than 3 months.</li> <li>Contestants come from homes where Japanese is not spoken regularly.</li> </ul>
Format of the competition:	<ul> <li>The three Judges will judge throughout the competition.</li> <li>An emcee will read the questions throughout the competition</li> <li>Only the Final Round is open to audiences.</li> </ul>
	We recognize that you, the teachers, are the foremost experts in teaching and testing Japanese language, culture, history, and current events. Thus, to ensure that the event retains the highest level of quality, the
	eligibility will require that each team's registration be accompanied by a minimum of 3 suggested questions (and answers). For example, if
	by a minimum of 3 suggested questions (and answers). For example, if a teacher plans to register teams for Level 1 and 3, that teacher must
	provide 3 Level 1 questions and 3 Level 3 questions. We would also
	welcome questions from each of your participating students as well. All
	questions should be submitted with the online registration.

	<ul> <li>Preliminary Round</li> <li>Each level will have one preliminary round.</li> <li>Preliminary Round will have 15 Questions and 2 Bonus Questions.</li> <li>15 Questions value at 10 points, and Bonus Questions value at 5 points each.</li> <li>Questions are read only once.</li> <li>During the preliminary round, each team has 30 seconds to write an answer on a provided answer sheet. Conferring is allowed between team members. Any member of the team may write the answer(s) to the question.</li> <li>The 3 teams with the highest scores in the preliminary round go on to the Final Round.</li> <li>Final Round</li> <li>During the Final Round, there will be 10 Toss-up questions valued at 10 points each, and 2 Bonus Questions valued at 5 points each.</li> <li>Teams will have 30 seconds to "ring-in" to signal their answer. The answer must be given immediately without delay, so ring in only when you are prepared to answer. The team member who "rings-in" must</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>answer the question.</li> <li>NO CONFERRING IS ALLOWED IN THE FINAL ROUND.</li> <li>During the Final Round, teams responding before a question has been read completely will not have the benefit of having the question re-read.</li> <li>In the event that there is a tie "ring-in" on a question, all teams signaling will be asked to write their answer on the paper provided.</li> <li>After a team "rings-in," the team members who rang-in must wait to be recognized by the Moderator's Aid.</li> <li>In case of a tie-breaker, all teams should remain in the area. Students who leave the competition area may be disqualified.</li> </ul>
Causes for Disqualification:	<ul> <li>Students leaving the competition site</li> <li>Disobeying rules &amp; regulations</li> <li>Use of offensive language</li> <li>Challenging or showing a lack of respect to the moderators, judges, staff, volunteers, and to other team members</li> </ul>
Prizes:	Prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place. Winners of the Level 2 and Level 3 will also be invited to educational trip to Japan as part of the Gen-J program during Fall break in 2019.
